Who should apply for the Bachelor of Technology in Applied Design (BTAD) program?

Students interested in becoming a lead designer or project manager who hold an associate of applied science (A.A.S.) degree or equivalent from a college or university in a design-related field would be ideal candidates for this program.

In addition to LWTC's multimedia and engineering graphics, feeder programs have been identified from these local community colleges: Bellevue, Everett, Green River, Highline, North Seattle, Pierce, Seattle Central, and Shoreline. What kind of employment opportunities are available with this degree?

Program graduates will be prepared to assume roles in the design industry that require them to lead and collaborate with teams of creative and technical professionals. The degree has a common core of courses that meets the academic and professional requirements of industry. The Applied Design core emphasizes design theory and practice, managing creativity, design technology, project management, entrepreneurship and professional issues.

What days and times of the week are classes offered?

Courses are offered in a hybrid format to accommodate the schedule of working students. Each class meets face-to-face once a week with the remainder of the coursework completed online so that students can continue to work during the day.

What does the program cost?

What if I have two years of college but not a technical associate's degree?

Students need to have completed an associate of applied science (A.A.S.) degree in a design-related field, or submit a completion plan by the start of their first quarter in the program.

What are the faculty qualifications?

Faculty in the Applied Design program are design professionals with extensive experience in the classroom and industry. All hold graduate degrees related to their area of instruction. Faculty are committed to student success, quality education, and the career advancement of their students.

Is the program accredited?

Lake Washington Technical College is accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities at the associate degree level and has been granted candidacy at the baccalaureate degree level.
