4. Below are the steps on requesting accommodations for the NCLEX
  - I. A recent letter from the physician stating the medical diagnosis, when was the student diagnosis, and how does the disability impact the student on the NCLEX.
  - II. A letter from the DSS Coordinator explaining why accommodations were granted to the student, what accommodations were given to the student and how long the student has utilized the DSS office?
  - III. A letter from the student requesting accommodations for the NCLEX.
  - IV. All three letters should be emailed to Renae Hannahs three months prior to registering for the test.
  - V. The student will receive an email from NCSBN (National Council of State Boards of Nursing) confirming the accommodations were granted.
  - VI. The student can log in to [www.pearsonvue.com/nclex](http://www.pearsonvue.com/nclex) to view what accommodations were granted.
  - VII. The student should read all the information very carefully.
5. A student cannot have white noise for the NCLEX.
6. Accommodations for the NCLEX will not be given on the medical diagnosis of test anxiety.
